





The curriculum of all UG and PG programmes is prescribed by S.N.D.T. University to which the college is affiliated. However, most of our faculty members are involved in curriculum developing as members of the various Boards of Studies.

The college conducts Career Oriented Programs (COPs) for undergraduate students.

The curriculums of these courses have been updated this year.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

To make the teaching-learning process more interesting and student-centric, the institution has provided new equipment to the teaching staff, viz. LCD, Internet, White board markers as well as the Scheme of Book Bank.

Our teachers use modern and innovative teaching methods while teaching other than the lecture method e.g. Paper presentation, Seminars, Co-operative teaching method, use of Audio-Visual aids etc.
