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#### 6.3. Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

##### 6.3.1. Curriculum development -

The College is affiliated to S.N.D.T Women's University and therefore follows the curriculum prescribed by the University for all UG and PG programmes. However, some of our faculty members are on the Board of Studies and involved in framing the syllabi. Most of the faculty members attend the workshops on syllabus revision that enhance their ability to deal with the curriculum. The inputs from these workshops are used as suggestions and carried to the University Board of Studies in their subject for further implementation. This Year the workshop on "Preparation of new syllabus at Undergraduate level for B. A. semester V and semester VI for disciplinary component Courses", under Faculty of Social Sciences for all the teachers of Conducted & Affiliated Colleges of SNDT Women's University, Mumbai, has been arranged on 8<sup>th</sup> December 2016 and the inputs from this workshop were sent to respective Board of Studies.

The College conducts certificate and diploma courses under Career Oriented Programme (C.O.P.) for undergraduate students where students from different disciplines are enrolled. Presently the College runs four Career Oriented Programmes viz.: a) Banking and Insurance b) Tally and Web Designing c) Travel and Tourism and; d) Spoken English.

##### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The new Teaching-learning methods include:

Participatory learning: Students are encouraged to ask questions, openly discuss and debate on various topics included in their syllabus. They are asked to prepare paper presentations, projects, conduct surveys, interviews, case studies, and do field-work. They are taken on various industrial visits, study-tours, (e.g.



industrial Visits to factories/industries, banks, and Study-tours to places of historical importance, museums, rural and tribal areas, NGO's etc.) Workshops, guest lectures, lecture series are conducted regularly.

New and innovative methods are used for teaching- learning in form of projectors, computer-assisted learning, use of network resources, use of audio cassettes/video cassettes, maps, charts, globe, dramatizations and role plays, films shows and documentaries, Research Projects and Internship.

Purchase of new editions / new books; regular upgrading of library resources enhances teaching quality.

Computer Laboratories are well maintained and upgraded to meet the requirement.

Wi-Fi connection to the Laptops enhances the teaching and learning process.

The academically weak students are identified and are mentored by faculty.

Review of academic results and feedback from the students enable teachers to improve their teaching methods.

### **6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation**

The College is affiliated to S.N.D.T. Women's University and follows all norms prescribed by the university while conducting the external examinations. Internal evaluation is conducted in each semester, and results are declared within the stipulated time.

For the internal assessment, faculty uses several innovative methods like home assignments, multiple choice questions, projects, problem solving, tutorials; and so on.

### **6.3.4. Research and Development**

The Research Committee of the College motivates faculty members to pursue research. College Research Journal published every year entitled 'In Search of Knowledge' (ISSN: 2278-1234). Faculty members are encouraged to publish research papers in journals and also present research papers in conferences/seminars through incentives like travel reimbursement or financial assistance for registration fee. Our Management continues to felicitate faculty members for their remarkable contribution in the field of teaching and research.

Students are encouraged to participate and present research papers in seminars at the University/State/National level and a few students presented papers in International conference. They are also motivated to do research by participating in 'Avishkaar', a SNTD Women's University initiative.

### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation

Our Institution is a member of N-List (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure of scholarly content) which is working under INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network Centre) that provides access to Electronic Journals and Electronic books. The annual Membership fees of Rs.5750/- is being subscribed by the institution.

Library creates its resources Database and provides Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) through which users can access from any of the computer connected in the LAN and know the status of the book.

For the effective utilisation of resources, Information Literacy orientation training programme is conducted for the students.

Book display and exhibition is held in the library to create awareness among the students about the latest arrivals and references.

Library is fully computerized and all library books are bar- coded.

Paper clippings are maintained in the library.

Open access to reference books is available to P.G. students.

Laptops with Wi-Fi connectivity are provided to the departments as well as upgraded Desktop monitors.

The entire College has two computer labs used by all departments.

LCD Projectors in almost all class rooms.

Maintenance of Labs/Class Rooms/Fans/Lights is taken due care of, at frequent intervals. Water Coolers have been installed for the use of students and the staff.

Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) for the repairs and maintenance of Computers, Softwares, Projectors, Air Conditioners and other equipments is in place.

### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Self Appraisal and API help in assessment of the faculty.
- Staff attendance is monitored on daily basis.
- Efforts are taken to train the faculty and staff to update their knowledge.
- IQAC creates awareness among faculty on quality in teaching & learning.
