BEST PRACTICE 2

Title :-

Context: Students too should be engaged in research practices and encouraged to prepare and

present research papers on a common platform in collaboration with other colleges.

Objectives: -

1. To introduce students to good research practices and available resources.

2. To encourage them to prepare and present standard research papers.

3. To interact with their peers at seminars and gain valuable feedback and insights.

The Practice: -

The History department has been consistently organizing intercollegiate Students' seminars in

collaboration with other college since 2014. It has collaborated with K.V. Pendharkar College,

Dombivli and P.L. Shroff College, Chinchani, Dist-Palghar and lately Arts and Commerce

College, Padghe, Dist-Thane. Each college hosts the event in rotation. Students present papers

and exchange feedback across colleges.

Obstacles faced: -

Poor response initially, nervousness and hesitancy about preparing research papers. Problem

of Geographical accessibility eg: Chinchani college, almost 150 kms away from Mumbai.

Evidence of Success: -

Students voluntarily participate in seminars and prepare papers. Many have overcome stage

fear and developed the habit of careful and deep research, number of participants increasing

every year.

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
