National Service Scheme Special Camp 18/12/2022 to 24/12/2022

Morning Session 18/12/2022

The day began with exercise, followed by NSS song and the University song. The camp was inaugurated by I/C Principal, **Dr Hiralal Lokhande** who spoke to volunteers about the importance of NSS and about youth and social responsibility and social commitment. **Dr Sunita Kulkarni and Dr Ramila Gaikwad**, Programme Officers, discussed the history of NSS, the need for students to devote time and effort to society and the benefits of NSS. The entire programme of the seven day camp was discussed with volunteers.

Afternoon Session

A session on '**Value Education**' was organized with **Dr Asavari Bhat** as the Resource Person. Dr Bhat spoke about ethics and stressed the importance of a strong value system for effective personality development in children and youth. Her session highlighted the following points:

- Importance of health, hygiene and value education in human life
- Role of parents and teachers in instilling values in children
- Focus on the three R's, reading, writing and arithmetic
- Importance of regular exercise, particularly Suryanamaskar for physical and mental wellness

Morning Session 19/12/2023

The day started with exercise and rendition of NSS and University songs. Dr Sujal Agrwal, working with BMC conducted a session on '**Breast and Cervical Cancer Awareness**'. He spoke in detail about the nature of cancer, the predominant causes and risk factors of cancer and provided advice about the screening and tests of detection and how one can reduce the risk of incurring it. Dr Agrawal gave information about the various vaccines available in order to prevent cervical cancer.

Ms Shubhangi Jadhav, Public Health Nurse, BMC, provided important inputs to the volunteers about menstruation, the hygiene and care required during the period and methods for alleviating menstrual cramps.



Afternoon Session

The afternoon session consisted of **Dr Suhasini Jawalekar** speaking on '**Goal-setting and Leadership**'. She defined leadership as providing guidance, showing path, encouraging and taking others towards a common goal. She stressed the following points:

- Importance of ethics, values and integrity in leaders.
- Goals being ambitious but achievable
- Personality development through leadership
- Qualities of leaders: selfless, honest, responsible, fair and just and inspiring others to excel. The session ended with question-answers.

Third Day Morning Session

The day began with Suryanamaskar and rendering of the NSS and University songs.

Ms Shobha Kokitkar, Coordinator, Family Counselling Centre, Stree Mukti Sanghatana, conducted a session on '**Women and Legal Literacy**'. Ms Kokitkar spoke at length about the gender disparity in India and the secondary status of Indian women. Though the constitution has given equal rights to men and women, women have to struggle hard to achieve anything. She spoke about some important legislations such as the Special Marriage Act, Domestic Violence Prevention Act and others supporting women. The following points were discussed by her:

- Need for family and marriage counselling centres
- Divorce and alimony
- Custody of children
- Domestic abuse
- Property rights of women
- Stree-dhan issues
- Helplines for crimes against women

Afternoon Session:

- Volunteers visited the neighbourhood area, submitted letters to several housing societies regarding plastic waste collection drive.
- Volunteers visited the neighbourhood area and collected plastic waste
- There were skits presented by the volunteers on 'Save Trees' and 'Eve teasing'.



Day Four 21/12/2022

Morning Session

The day began with exercise and NSS and University songs. The morning session was conducted by **Ms Asha Kulkarni** who spoke on '**Organ Donation**'. Ashatai is the General Secretary, Anti-Dowry Movement and works as a Civil Society member on many Govt committees such as District Women Advisory Committee, Ministry of Women & Child Development One Stop Centre Scheme, Selection Committee for 'Mahila Shakti Kendra' among others. She explained that organ donation involves the donation of important organs after a person's death that can improve the life of a human being, and ensure life after death. She explained that most Indians do not donate bodies after death as there are religious superstitions associated with organ donation. She stressed the need for more donors as there are many critical patients waiting for another chance at life. Ashatai elaborated the donation process as to who can donate, which organs can be donated and the timings associated with keeping the parts harvested properly. She mentioned the 1994 Human Organ Transplantation Act and explained that there is a waiting list of patients who are allotted organs as per legislative guidelines. She stressed the need for increasing awareness about organ donation and removal of superstitions about it

Afternoon Session:

There were student presentations about issues such as '**Azadi ke 75 Saal**' '**Women's Empowerment**', role play and confidence building exercises.

Day Five 22/12/2022

Morning Session

The day began with exercises, NSS and University songs.

There was a play performance '**Mein Aisa Kyun Hun**' by **Anumit Natak sanstha**, Mumbai, organized by **Shri Sumit Tambe** and his group of schoolchildren on the subject of sexuality and gender identity. The play intended to shed light on the idea of sexuality and discussed the following concepts for awareness:

- Gender stereotyping,
- sexuality
- sexual identity,
- Masculinity and femininity
- Societal and peer group pressure.

The play was well-received by volunteers as the child actors were successful in getting the ideas across to the audience.



Afternoon Session

Ms Vanita Sable conducted a session on 'Guidance for Competitive Examinations'. Ms Sable is head of 'Creative Education and Activities Centre' that provides guidance for MPSC, UPSC and Banking sector examinations. She spoke at length about the following points:

- Women empowerment
- Gender equality through equal opportunity
- Empowerment through education and financial independence
- The need for women to participate in important administrative structures.

After a question and answer session, the day ended with singing the NSS song and the National Anthem.

Morning Session 23/12/2023

The day began with Suryanamaskar and the rendition of NSS and University songs.

The morning session was a performance of the famous play 'Mulagi Zali Ho' by the volunteers of Stree Mukti Sanghatana. Stree Mukti Sanghatana was founded in 1975 and attempts to spread Awareness about women's issues. They run several Family Counselling Centres and Creches in various areas of Mumbai. The play, written by Jyotitai Mhapasekar in 1983, consists of several songs and presents the following ideas for awareness:

- Female foeticide
- Gender disparity and gender sensitization
- Evils of dowry, bride burning
- Gender equality
- Infertility and its consequences for women

The play was very well received by the student volunteers and staff members.

Afternoon Session

There was another Plastic Collection Drive in the afternoon as well as presentations from volunteers about issues of gender inequality in the society. Several volunteers shared their own experiences and stressed the need for women's education and financial autonomy.

Morning Session 24/12/2023

Shri Sumit Tambe conducted a 'Streetplay Workshop' for the volunteers. He tutors theatre enthusiasts in 'Actor-Prepare' and provided useful insights. He conducted activities for:



- Overcoming stage fear
- Overcoming inhibitions
- Preparing for careers in the public domain
- Confronting one's worst fears and speaking about it
- Catharsis through expression
- Importance of focus and goals in life
- Collecting experiences through observation

The session was extremely successful as activities ensured active student participation.

Afternoon Session

The session began with feedback from volunteers who spoke about the various programmes and activities organized during the camp. They expressed gratitude about their skill enhancement through camp activities. Several volunteers provided formal feedback about the camp and provided overview about all the seven day activities.

The Valedictory address was delivered by Principal in Charge, Dr. Hiralal Lokhande who spoke about the advantages of social service for personality development. He also informed the volunteers about Government schemes and initiatives for student progress.

The volunteers presented a brief Cultural Programme. The Special Camp ended with a vote of thanks and proved to be a success.

Library

Library is fully automated since 2009-10. The managing of circulation. Cataloguing, serial control and OPAC (Online Public Access Cataloguing) is done through this system. A reading collection of 41842 books and 23 journals are available to readers in the library. E-books and e-journals are made available to the readers through the e-search Sindhu program.

Maintenance of Infrastructure: A full time contractor has been appointed to look after the maintenance of all buildings in the campus, including the Sports Complex by managing committee.




Funds for maintenance are allocated and maintenance work is executed through AMC(Annual Maintenance Contract) for laboratory, library equipments and CCTV. The support staff looks after the cleanliness of the college campus.

The college library is fully automated with Slim 21 Library software. The maintenance of the software is done through AMC with Algorithn Consultants PVT.LTD. with regular upgradation in the version of the software. The maintenance of Library Learning resources is done through regular fumigation work. The maintenance of reprographic machine is done through AMC contract to Accutech Info System Pvt. Ltd.

The maintenance of computers is done by annual contract. The contractor visits the college regularly for maintaining the computers, Printers and LCD. The maintenance of carpenter work and electrical work is done by the contractor appointed by the parent body.

The maintenance of fire extinguisher and refilling is done by time to time by M/s Shri Om Fire Services.

The maintenance of water supply i.e. cleaning tank, repairing work of water coolers and Aqua guards is done regularly.
